The story is "Goldilocks and the Three Bears."</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> Let's look at the title page. What comes in threes?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> There are three kittens. There are three pairs of mittens. There are three hats on the kittens.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What other groups of threes do you see on the pages?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answers: I see three jars of honey. I see three magic beans. The lady has three wishes. I see three goats. I see three little pigs.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> Let's look at the pages of the book and say a sentence for each picture that follows the pattern on pages 7-8.</p> <p><b>A1:</b> Possible answers: There are three bears, but there is only one Goldilocks. There are three magic beans, but there is only one cow. There are three Billy Goats Gruff, but there is only one mean troll.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> Let's look around and think. What other things come in threes?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answers: A triangle has three sides. A tricycle has three wheels. I eat three meals a day: breakfast, lunch, and dinner.</p>
