He is using sign language.</p> <p>Q2: What do you think the boy is signing, or saying with his hand?</p> <p>A2: Possible answers: I think he is signing "hello." I think the boy is signing "peace." I think the boy is making the sign for "love." Let's read the book and find out!</p>	<p>Q1: What people do we meet in the story?</p> <p>A1: We meet the main character, a boy. He introduces us to his dad, mom, best friend, and brother.</p> <p>Q2: What does the main character encourage the reader to try?</p> <p>A2: The main character encourages the reader to try signing common words.</p>	<p>Q1: What words did you learn to sign?</p> <p>A1: We learned to sign "dad," "help," "police officer," "mom," "doctor," "friend," and "brother."</p> <p>Q2: What expression (sentence) did you learn to sign?</p> <p>A2: We learned to sign "I love you!"</p>
