Can you retell the story using the map?</p> <p>A2: Answers will vary.</p>

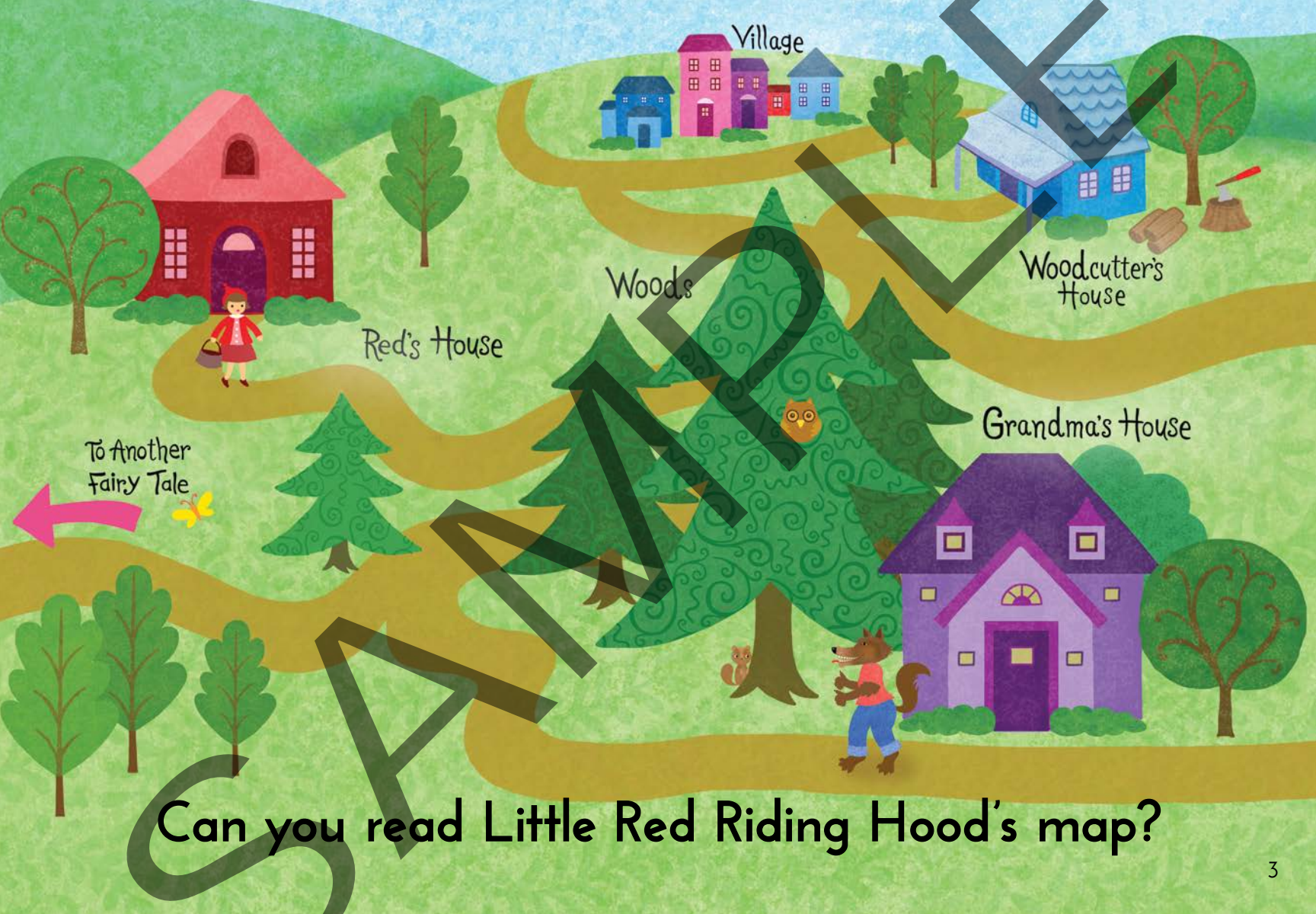
