<p><b>Q1:</b> What do you see on the cover?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> I see six children. I see a monkey holding onto a vine. I see an elephant, a deer, a pig, and a fish.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What could these children do like the animals in the picture?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> The children could hop like the frog and swim like the fish. The children could run like the deer and hold onto a vine like the monkey.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> What habitats provide the backdrop for the children and animals?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> The habitats are the deep blue sea, the forest, the jungle, and a pond.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What are the children doing like the animals?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> A boy is swimming and breathing underwater. A girl is flying. One boy is swinging on a vine and another boy is running. A girl is hopping.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> Can people move like animals?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> Possible answers: Yes, people can run, jump, swim, climb and swing. 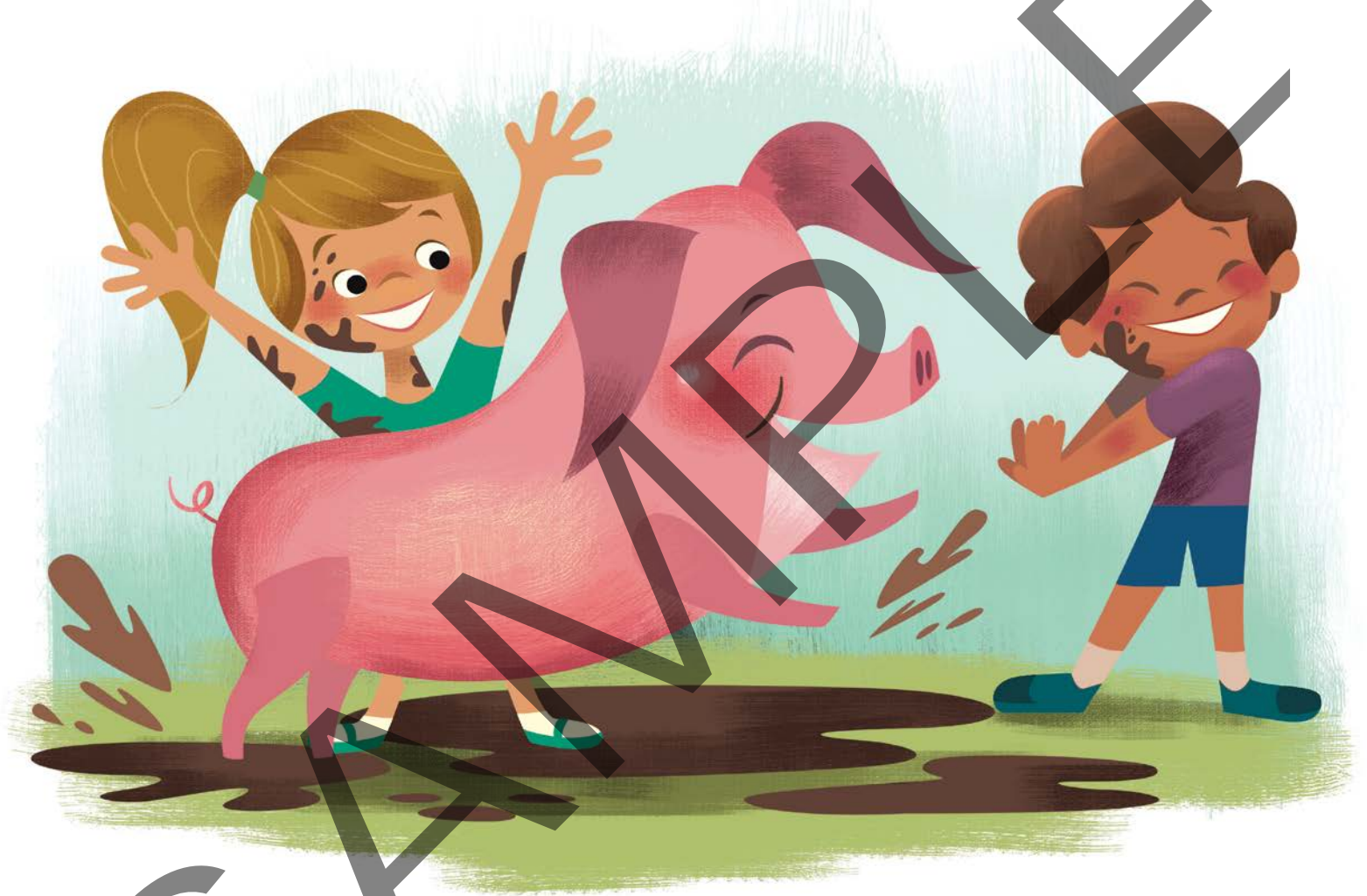
