They made tools from animal horns. They made arrows from sharp stones.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> How did people long ago make necklaces, boats, and houses?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Long, long ago, people made necklaces from shells and animal teeth. They made boats from trees. They made houses from animal skins.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> Do some people still make things like this today?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> Yes, it's true! Some people still do these things today.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> How are people from long ago the same as people of today?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> People from long ago needed clothing, transportation, and tools.</p>
