What does your bear look like?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Answers will vary: My bear is brown and black. He wears a little T-shirt. He is about 12 inches tall. My bear is soft and furry.</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> What things do we look at in the story?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> We look at houses, pictures, pets, teddy bears, balloons, bugs, and monsters.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What helps us choose the right object or creature in the story?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> We read the clues. The clues help us choose!</p>	<p><b>Q1:</b> What are some ways we describe things?</p> <p><b>A1:</b> Possible answers: We describe things by their size, shape, and color. We describe things by looking at the details. For example, we look at how many spots, eyes, legs, or buttons they have.</p> <p><b>Q2:</b> What other ways can we describe things?</p> <p><b>A2:</b> Possible answer: We can describe things by using our other senses. We can describe how things feel, sound, smell, and taste.</p>
