

Count and Add with Me!

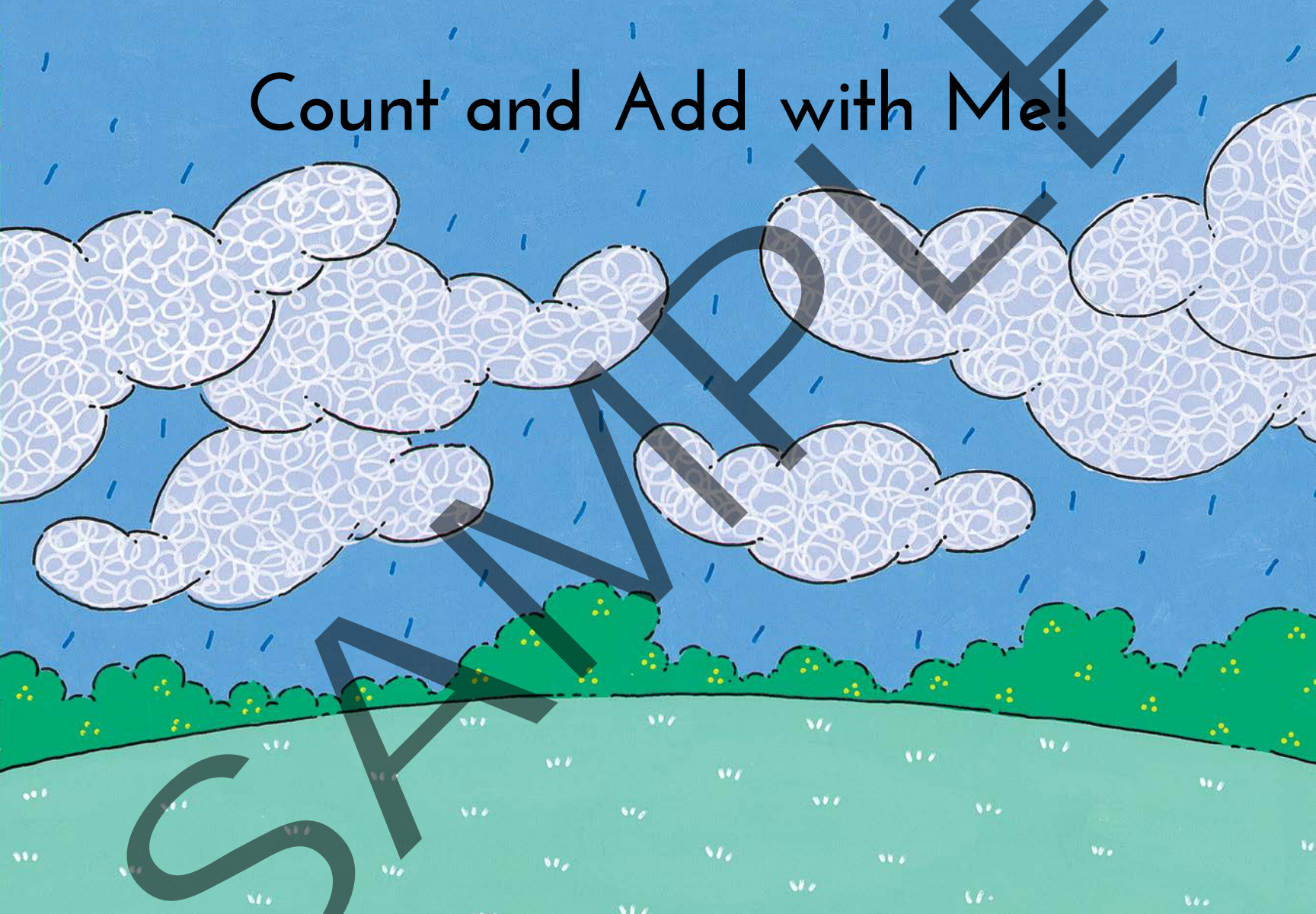

<p>Q1: Let's look at the cover and read the title. How many trees can you count?</p> <p>A1: I can count four trees.</p> <p>Q2: What do you think this book will be about?</p> <p>A2: Possible answers: I think this book will be about a little girl and her dog. She wants us to take a walk with her and count things we see.</p>	<p>Q1: Where did the little girl and her dog go walking, counting, and adding?</p> <p>A1: They went walking in the rain, then around a tree, and under the water in the sea. They went in a flower garden and on a hill.</p> <p>Q2: What things did we count and add with her?</p> <p>A2: We counted and added ladybugs, funny fish, bees, pretty flowers, fluffy rabbits, and fun friends.</p>	<p>Q1: How did you answer each question in the story?</p> <p>A1: Seven ladybugs and five more equals twelve ladybugs. Six funny fish and six more equals twelve funny fish. Seven bees and seven more equals fourteen bees. Etc.</p> <p>Q2: Can you say and write the addition sentences for all the things you counted and added?</p> <p>A2: Yes! $7 + 5 = 12$ $6 + 6 = 12$ $7 + 7 = 14$ Etc.</p>
