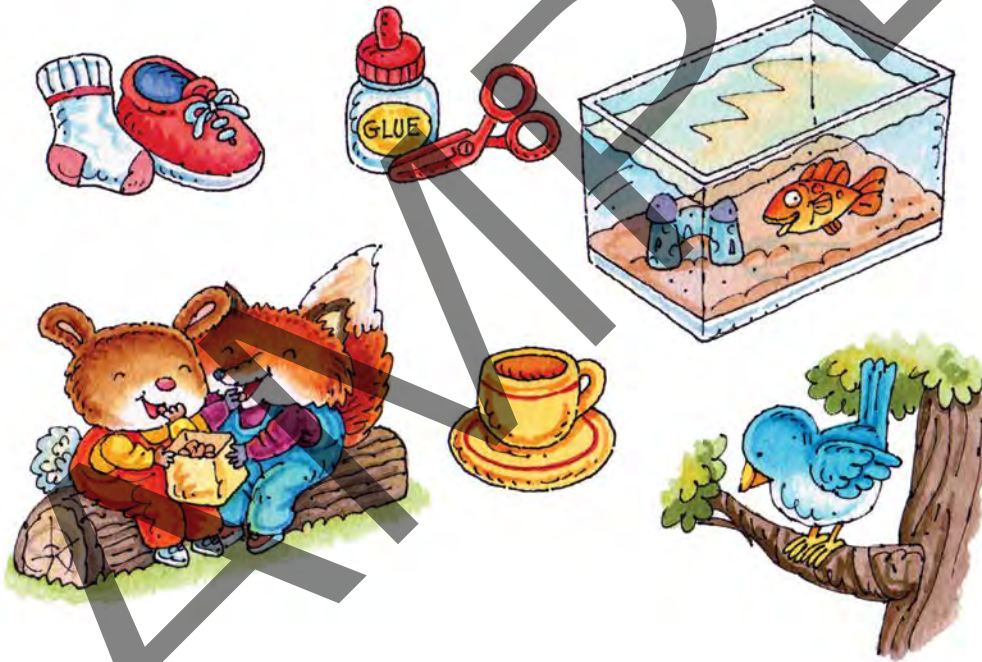


What Goes Together?

The friends will look for more things that go together. The friends will try to catch the frog.</p> <p>Q2: Can you think of other things that go together?</p> <p>A2: Possible answers: A pencil and paper go together. A table and chairs go together. Peanut butter and jelly go together. A spoon and a fork go together.</p>
